7. FISCAL YEAR 2025/26 SHORT RANGE TRANSIT PLAN UPDATES

This item is for the Committee to receive and file the Fiscal Years (FY) 2025/26 – FY 2027/28 Short Range Transit Plans (SRTPs) for the cities of Banning, Beaumont, Corona, and Riverside; Palo Verde Valley Transit Agency (PVVTA), Riverside Transit Agency (RTA); SunLine Transit Agency (SunLine) and the FY 2025/26 – 2029/30 SRTP for the Commission's Rail and Vanpool Programs.

Eric DeHate presented a brief overview of the FY 2025/25 short range transit plan updates. He discussed the Coachella Valley rail funding allocation, federal funding, and local funding.

Lorelle Moe-Luna, Multimodal Services Director, discussed the federal funding and formula allocations in response to Chair Krick's question regarding any possible changes in federal funding sources.

Public Hearing was called to order at 11:14 a.m. by Chair John Krick.

Chair John Krick: We are going to open the public hearing today to receive comments about transit needs in Riverside County, particularly the gaps of service and areas where coverage is needed. We encourage members of the public who have comments regarding specific drivers, missed route trips or Dial-A-Ride, contact the service provider directly. Our role today is to listen to your comments and to work with staff and transit partners to have them addressed. The public hearing is now open. Clerk, can you announce written comments that have been received?

Allie Rackerby: As Eric DeHate said we have a total of 21 received comments.

Chair John Krick: Comments will be limited to three minutes. When we call on you, we ask you to introduce yourself, the city or area that you are from, and a phone number or email address if you would like us to follow up with you. For anybody who has just joined the meeting and would like ASL or Spanish translation services, please inform us and it will be provided. Ok, translators could you ask if there's anyone whose joined who could use your services?

Eric DeHate: No one here at SunLine has joined.

Chair John Krick: Clerk lets start in the east. Do we have any members of the public wishing to make comments at the Palo Verde satellite location?

Allie Rackerby: I don't see any hands raised.

Chair John Krick: Clerk, do we have any members of the public wishing to make comments at the SunLine location?

Michael Harrington: Here?

Eric DeHate: Yes. Would anyone like to make any public comments? No?

Michael Harrington: I would like to. Michael Harrington in Rancho Mirage. I'm also a member. I wanted to point out that Rancho Mirage, it seems to be a gap in the service for the SunRide. It's called SunRide but its kinda like Uber but it seems a miss right by Rancho Mirage at least in my neighborhood, Tamarisk, not far from city hall, DaVall, Gerald Ford, Frank Sinatra, that neighborhood. So I just wanted to point that out.

Chair John Krick: Thank you.

Gloria Sanchez: Can you paraphrase what he said. We can't, we didn't really hear the entire comment.

Allie Rackerby: Eric?

Eric DeHate: So, I'll turn back over to Mr. Harrington. If he could restate his comment? Do you want to sit here and restate your comment?

Michael Harrington: Oh, ok.

Eric DeHate: If you don't mind speaking up a little bit more.

Michael Harrington: I live in Rancho Mirage and I can't find a SunRide. The staff here has been very helpful but it seems that that wasn't included last time they did an analysis so it wasn't deemed that it was needed. There was a lot of elderly people, transportation challenged people in my neighborhood that I believe would benefit and me, I would benefit, my household would benefit from the SunRide. It's kind of like an Uber, I understand. I did download the app to look into it. There is a gap right in my neighborhood. I don't know, I think there may have been a misunderstanding thinking that everyone has a chauffeur in Rancho Mirage or something. There's a lot of elderly people living in my neighborhood. I see them struggle with transportation and some of them are a little too old to drive. I've helped a neighbor before that was having problems with her own car. Even though she has a car she's had some problems with it. So, I think lets take a look at that again. I'm on DaVall between Frank Sinatra and Gerald Ford in that

Tamarisk neighborhood area. So that's just what I wanted to share. Thank you for letting me participate.

Chair John Krick: Thank you. Eric, is there anyone else that wishes to make a comment from your location?

Eric DeHate: No. I don't see any other members of the public that wish to make a comment.

Chair John Krick: I see that we have a member of the public that wishes to make comments here at the Riverside location. So, I'll ask Adrian Rizzo.

Adrianna Rizzo: Adrianna Rizzo. Where should I stand to audible? Here or over there?

Allie Rackerby: Yeah, you should be able to be heard from anywhere in the room.

Adrianna Rizzo: Ok. My name is Adrianna Rizzo. I live in Riverside. I am here representing Inland Urbanists and Californians for Electric Rail. I am a rider of the RTA 1, 16, and 10 buses primarily as well as Metrolink. Just across the board, I would like to see a lot more service on bus and Metrolink. Obviously there are budget constraints but I think RCTC should be working to increase the share of funds available for transit so that people have real alternatives to driving. I have several friends who don't own cars and I spend a lot of time driving them around because their mobility is very limited in the current situation and this is in Riverside which has probably the best transit of anywhere in the county. Some specific suggestions, I would like to see bus service extended to midnight and have a little bit better frequency between 8 and 10 p.m. I've gotten stranded before because the service was so unreliable. I would also like to see on buses like the 10 that have kind of irregular hours to have regular hourly service which makes it a lot easier to use as well as somewhat increasing the frequency. I'd also like to see bus service on holidays. I think it's unacceptable that RTA completely cancels service on holidays. People still have places to be. You should be providing weekend service instead of cancelling it all together. Another thing I would like to see is more intercounty connections. So, one specific example would be having the Redlands Arrow Trains, whether they're ending in San Bernardino or running some of those into Riverside County so you can take a one seat ride from Riverside to Redlands. I go to Redlands pretty often but it's quite difficult to get there on transit. I'd also like to see more weekend service on Metrolink. It's really, it hasn't improved at all. It's really hard to use and it's quite popular. The beach trains are packed but they only run two trains a day in the summer. If we could get at least one more train on the weekends that would be great, ideally more than that. In terms of long term goals, I'd like to see RCTC really prioritize more Metrolink service by making sure that the third track from Fullerton to Riverside gets done in a quick manner. It's really going to be important for reliability and frequency. And to move faster on both the Coachella Valley Rail as well as the rail extension to Hemet which has been planned but doesn't seem like there is any progress happening there. You know, these are rapidly growing areas where a lot of people are living and there's really no good transit options for people at least for long distance trips. Finally, RCTC should start planning for electrification of Metrolink. This is Unmet Transit Needs Hearing Monday, August 11, 2025 Page 4

obviously a long term project but we need to start thinking about it. This is in the State Rail Plan, electrifying from Fullerton up to San Bernardino. Riverside, the inland empire is going to be a rail hub soon with Brighline West arriving in Rancho Cucamonga in just three or four years. And there's future plans for maybe high-speed rail to Phoenix one day via Riverside so electrification supports all of that in addition to making service faster and more frequent. Caltrain is seeing 75% ridership growth in one year after electrifying due to brand new service. The High-Speed Rail Authority has already come to an agreement with BNSF about electrifying over tracks on a different portion of that right of way so it can be done. And so I encourage RCTC to start moving forward on those negotiations so that we can eventually get electric service all the way up to San Bernardino. Oh, and one of my other comments is that this meeting should really have a hybrid option. I see you have a hybrid option for the Commissioners, why isn't that available to the public? This meeting being only in person on a work day is very inaccessible especially for people who are mobility challenged and not well served by transit, who are the people this meeting is supposed to be reaching. I encourage you to add a phone or a zoom option when this happens next year. Thank you for your time. Have a great day.

Chair John Krick: Thank you for those comments.

Lisa Castilone: I have a question.

Chair John Krick: Yes.

Lisa Castilone: You mention one of the rails having a ridership increase.

Adrianna Rizzo: So, Caltrain which is a commuter rail between San Francisco and San Jose, the ridership went up by 75% over one year, like since last year, after they electrified.

Chair John Krick: Are there any more comments? Ok. The public hearing is now closed. Thank you to everyone who has participated and provided comments today. Staff will share these comments with the transit operators for future service improvements.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION:

The CSTAC's purpose is to assist the Commission in complying with Transportation Development Act (TDA) regulation, to promote transportation service improvements and enhancements that support the mobility of older adults, persons with disabilities and persons of limited means, and to establish an effective communication exchange among Riverside County's public transit operators, its specialized transportation providers and representatives of its transit dependent populations regarding matters of mutual concern.

More specifically, the CSTAC is required to annually participate in the identification of transit needs throughout the county, review proposed operating and capital projects of seven public transit operators and RCTC's Rail Program and represent the needs of transit users. In addition to these required topics, there is opportunity for additional items that can be brought forward to strengthen the CSTAC's role in promoting transit needs and priorities throughout the county. This item is to seek feedback on future agendas that will help the CSTAC advance its purpose and goals.
