Transportation Connects Our Lives

Going to work. Taking your children to school. Shopping for groceries. Visiting family and friends. Attending sporting events. Riding your bike. Seeing your doctor. Walking your dog. These day-to-day activities connect us to what's important, and they require a transportation system that works in Menifee.

Whether we travel by car, train, bus, bicycle or on foot, an efficient and well-maintained transportation system benefits the City of Menifee. The better our infrastructure, the better our quality of life. Just as repairs to your home or vehicle have to be made, maintaining our transportation infrastructure is equally important.

Funds for Transportation Infrastructure

The Gas Tax, or Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), is the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, which was approved by California's Legislature in April 2017. The Gas Tax generates funds for our transportation infrastructure through increased gasoline taxes and annual vehicle fees. It began to provide funds to cities and counties in November 2017.

Protection for Transportation Revenues

The passage of Proposition 69 on June 5, 2018 provides constitutional protection for transportation revenues generated by the Gas Tax. The State Legislature and Governor will be prohibited from borrowing or diverting Gas Tax funds for uses other than transportation.

What The Gas Tax Provides for Menifee

The City of Menifee is expected to receive close to \$1.6 million per year in Gas Tax revenue, which almost doubles funds for transportation maintenance and upgrades. In Menifee, the Gas Tax is currently funding projects to rehabilitate and improve local roads.

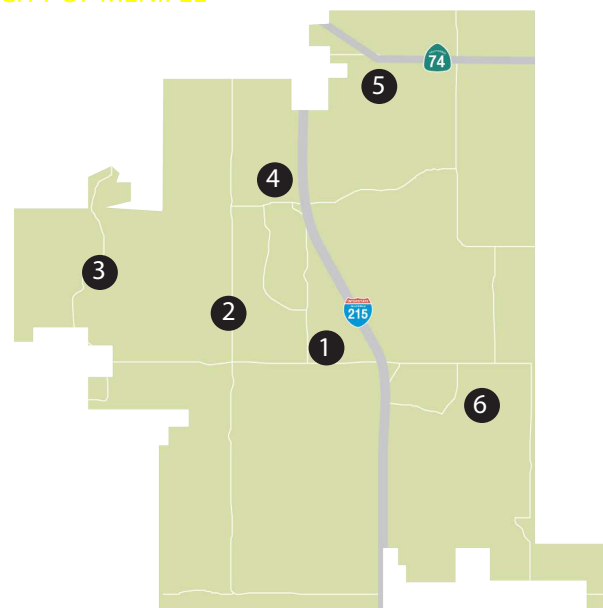
Highlighted Menifee Projects

- 1 Rustlers Ranch – pavement rehabilitation
- 2 Murrieta Road – pavement resurfacing, restriping
- 3 Goetz Road – pavement resurfacing
- 4 Sun City Street – pavement resurfacing
- 5 Sherman Road – pavement resurfacing
- 6 Menifee Road – repaving

In addition to projects like these, the Gas Tax provides funds for the Freeway Service Patrol roadside assistance in western Riverside County, Metrolink commuter train service, and local bus service county-wide.

Menifee Projects Funded by the Gas Tax

MENIFEE PROJECTS FUNDED BY THE GAS TAX

LOCATION	IMPROVEMENT DESCRIPTION
1 Rustlers Ranch Neighborhood	Two phases of road rehabilitation totaling 4.6 miles
2 Murrieta Road	Repave/resurface roadway between Newport Road and McCall Blvd., including restriping for bike lanes and installing signs
3 Goetz Road	Resurface 2.7 miles of major roadway; install guardrail
4 Sun City Street	Resurface 1.8 miles of residential streets
5 Sherman Road	Rebuild .35 miles of major road
6 Menifee Road	Repave 1.5 miles of local arterial road
7 Briggs Road	Repave 1 mile of local major road
8 Watson Road	Rebuild .4 miles of industrial road
9 Mapes Road	Repave/resurface 2.2 miles of local rural road
10 Garbani Road	Resurface 1 mile of major road
11 Palomar Road	Resurface 1 mile of major road
12 Ethanac Road	Rebuild .8 miles of local major road
13 Cherry Hills Blvd. Resurfacing	Repave 1 mile of local major road
14 Rouse Road	Repave .7 miles of local major road
