**Notice of Availability of 2022 Americans with Disabilities Act
(ADA) Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan for RCTC**

The Riverside County Transportation Commission, also known as RCTC, is a multimodal transportation planning organization that supports the region's economy, environment, and quality of living. Established in 1976, the 33-member Commission ensures all residents are represented in developing, planning, and implementing regional transportation solutions.

RCTC administers state and federal funds to Riverside County communities to improve sidewalks, bike lanes, and accessibility for persons with disabilities. RCTC owns the 91/Perris Valley Line rail corridor and owns and operates the nine Metrolink commuter rail stations in Riverside County. RCTC is committed to providing safe, reliable, courteous, accessible, and user-friendly services and to meeting legal requirements for providing readily accessible facilities to, and useable by, individuals with disabilities.

The 2022 ADA Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan for RCTC are mandated by Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Americans with Disabilities Act Title II for any public entity having 50 or more employees. Accordingly, RCTC has prepared a draft ADA Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan.

The Self-Evaluation examines services, programs, policies, practices, buildings, and facilities to identify problems or barriers that may limit accessibility by persons with disabilities.

The Transition Plan describes structural changes required to make buildings and facilities accessible by removing architectural barriers to access that were identified during accessibility surveys of the facilities conducted by members of the ADA Self-evaluation team on behalf of RCTC.

As part of this process, RCTC is seeking comments from the public regarding the data and findings in the draft Plan. All comments will be reviewed, considered, responded to, and included in the final plan.

A 40-day review period of the draft 2022 Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan for RCTC begins **April 18, 2022** and ends **May 28, 2022**.
