RCTC Traffic Relief Plan



Approved by the Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) on April 10, 2024, the Traffic Relief Plan outlines aspirational transportation solutions in Riverside County for Riverside County residents.

The updated Plan identifies the need to invest in crucial transportation projects, services, and infrastructure, including public transportation, roadway safety, highway improvements, active transportation, securing infrastructure from natural disasters, and environmental mitigation.

Project Background

The new non-tolled interchange is designed to improve safety, expand access to other modes of travel, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, enhance traffic flow, and support continued movement of native wildlife through the area. Construction is anticipated to be completed in 2025.
